Erricka Bridgeford

Co-Founder, Baltimore Ceasefire 365 (Baltimore Peace Movement)

In 2007, Erricka Bridgeford's brother was murdered. In response to her pain, she adopted the motto, "Live out loud....regardless, despite, and because..." In the months that



followed her brother's death, she began doing stand-up comedy to address society's reaction to her being born with only one hand — a trajectory that led her to become a community activist and inspirational speaker. Whether addressing her birth injury or advocating for families of homicide victims, Ms. Bridgeford has used her voice to inspire positive change and motivate others. "One voice makes a difference," she says. In 2017, Ms. Bridgeford co-founded Baltimore Ceasefire 365, recently re-branded as the Baltimore Peace Movement, a life-affirming event that has received global attention. Erricka Bridgeford was named 2017 Marylander of the Year by the *Baltimore Sun*.
